UNITED TRIBES TECHNICAL COLLEGE PROJECT BASED ASSISTANCE

Burleigh County Housing Authority (hereafter BCHA) and United Tribes Technical College (hereafter UTTC) entered into an agreement on May 21, 2007, for BCHA to provide six (6) two-bedroom Project Based Assistance Vouchers through BCHA's Housing Choice Voucher Program to eligible students of UTTC. These six (6) Vouchers are used for the tax credit units at August Little Soldier Apartments on UTTC Campus.

This shall be administered in accordance with the Burleigh County Housing Authority's Housing Choice Voucher Program Administrative Plan with the following exceptions:

- Applicants must be an eligible student.
- Program Participants cannot pay more than 30 percent of their income as their rent portion under a lease with this project.
- Assistance is not transferable or portable to any other location.
- This project is maintained by a separate waiting list.

<u>Definition</u>: Determining the eligibility of students who are head or co-head of a household

- A. The individual must be of legal contract age under state law.
- B. The individual must have established a household separate from parents or legal guardians for at least one year prior to application for occupancy or the individual meets the U.S. Department of Education's definition of an independent student, and meets one of the following criteria:
 - You will be at least 24 years old by December 31 of this year;
 - You were an orphan or a ward of the court through the age of 18;
 - You are a veteran of the U.S. Armed Forces;
 - You have legal dependents other than a spouse (for example, dependent children or an elderly dependent parent and must not be claimed as a dependent pursuant to IRS regulations for the past 12 months)
 - You are a college graduate and pursuing a master's degree, etc.;
 - You are married; or
 - The applicant must be of legal contract age and <u>cannot</u> be claimed as a dependent pursuant to IRS regulations
- C. The individual must not be claimed as a dependent by parents or legal guardians pursuant to IRS regulations.
- D. The individual must obtain a certification of the amount of financial assistance that will be provided by parents, guardians or others signed by the individual providing the support. This certification is required even if no assistance will be provided. The financial assistance provided by persons not living in the unit is part of annual income that must be verified to determine eligibility and at annual recertification to determine rent.
